I was having serious problems with two different blood disorders and on top of that I was diagnosed with lupus. My energy level was non-existent and I just seemed to have the "Blahs" all the time. I even had the "Poor Me's" really bad because a trip to visit orphan's in Russia was coming up and I wanted to go but felt I would be a burden to the team because I just had no energy. God knows my heart and how I love these precious children always amazed at how mis-He has allowed us to work with.

One night, while going through all of this, I had a dream. I dreamed we folks in Russia and Ukraine were in a huge auditorium surrounded by hundreds of orphans. One by one the children came and shook our hands as they were leaving. I noticed how empty their eyes looked. Each one was smiling but their seemed to be no life in them. When at last the last young lady walked by. She looked like she liked to joke around and so do I. I said, "What is your name?" She ing, not even decent living said in a joking manor, "My name is nobody." I said, "No really, what is facilities or nursing care. your name?" Again she responded, "Oh, my name is nobody." Finally I said with authority, "What is your name?" She responded by saying, "My precious souls. name is NOBODY.'

I immediately woke up from my dream crying. I shared my dream with my husband and I realized this is exactly how these children feel about themselves. They think of themselves as "Nobody's". They are told that by their own societies. They are treated as secondary citizens and no one visits them. They are institutionalized and forgotten.

Later after I told my friend about my dream she gave me this scripture them. verse from Romans 9:25 and 26 from the "Message which says:

I'll call nobodies and make them somebodies, I'll call the unloved and make them beloved. In the place where they yelled out, "You're nobody!"

They're calling you "God's living children.

I went to Russia on the very next trip and shared my dream in churches and with our teams and told them the importance of reminding these precious folks that they are "Sombody" in the eyes of the Lord.

When my husband came back from his trip to Ukraine and Russia in May he showed me his pictures of the trip. To fore we must love them as my surprise I saw the very girl pictured above and knew immediately she was the one I saw in my dream. She also gave and our neighbors and we her heart to the Lord as my husband presented the Gospel to the "Nobody's" who are now "Somebody's" in the Lord. Without your prayers and support this might never have happened.
