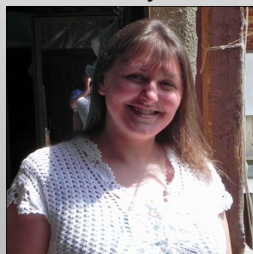

This week was so much fun and we had such blessings that the heart rejoices. And the main thing was a lot of trips, meetings, projects - well, what could be better than it.

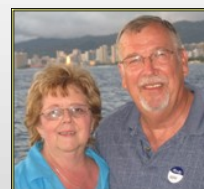
I want to write about one member of our team. She sometimes goes to the orphanage by herself near her own village because her family is near and her story is this: "Near the orphanage I came to visit my cousins, who live there. They were not home and I was waiting for them in the yard. When I came a little girl named Bogdanochka, she was about three years old, held out her hands to me and said, " Mom ." Then came another baby, and said, " why don't you be my mom and take me home." I burst into tears and walked away from that area . I will never forget that day. These kids stayed in my heart. I wanted the kids to know our Savior. I began to visit these dear children again. I began to pray with them . They all have one request to God, I want my mother and father . Then I talked with the older boy his name is Peter - he was 6 years old. When I talked to him about God , he said that he had a secret room - a sandbox in the yard and that he went there in the evening to pray. Thank you NHOM International that we have you. Your help to these children has been an encouragement to all of us. Thanks for your support, my brothers and sisters, and I can go to these children and give joy in the Lord. May God richly bless you in everything." That's such a beautiful sister God gave to our team .

We visited a shelter for kids . It was interesting and fun for the children . They're different ages . After the prayers and words of our Savior , we played a lot with them, tried to give them as much love of God as we could. Children wrote letters to Jesus. We could not read these letters without shedding tears of great joy.

We visited a nursing home. Tried to pay attention to each old person, praying, singing, talking and listening to them and they were so excited to see us.

We visited another nursing home. On this trip we had a brother who plays the guitar and he sang very beautifully and also spoke with the grandmothers . The Holy Spirit touched me and I was wiping tears . This was a very blessed trip. In the end we prayed for everyone. I came to one grandmother, who sat quietly and silently during all communication. I began to pray for her. She sat silently for a while, and then started crying- stronger and stronger, more and more . The Holy Spirit did His work , then she began to speak and I saw how much pain was in this woman's heart.

We were at one of the orphanages in Perm. There are 50 children in that place. We prepared a special program about Christmas for them. I took one girl to my home

from this orphanage and we were at the church together on Sunday.

In December we also visited an orphanage in Zakamsk. There were about 60 children, age from 5 to



16. We brought gifts for them.



We continue to visit a drug rehab center for teenagers. There are about 20 children but this number varies almost daily. We also told them about Christmas and gave sweet candy gifts to them. They were really thirsty for God. They have a lot of questions about God. And all of them accepted Jesus as their Lord and Savior.

We visited a prison center for children. There were 25 teenagers at this time and of course this number changes daily as well. We talked with them about the choices we and they make daily in our lives. We met several children from the different orphanages there.

They were surprised to see us there.

We were in a shelter "Raduga" in Perm. There are 50 children. We also invited them to the church for Christmas drama. We invited children from 3 orphanages to the church. Our pastor gave us buses to transport them. Praise God!

In the beginning of January we had two camps, in two different places. The first one was at the shelter "Doverie" and the second one we had in a new orphanage. In the first place were 25 children, age from 3 to 14. We had two sisters who work with small children, it was great! And we had 12 volunteers in our team. We used our program "You are special" in both places. At the end of each camp we prayed together and presented them crowns and said that they are princes and princesses of the King. At the second shelter we had 20 children, age 8 to 16. It was interesting to see a difference between the two shelters. At the second place children were very excited about all our program and they all expected Jesus as their Lord and Savior. We went to ice skate together with all children. It was great! At the last day we had a wonderful celebration together with ice-cream. We met there one gypsy girl. I saw her many times near the church building asking for money. She also opened her heart for God in the shelter.

What a great time we had while Pastor John Shane and his team from America were here in December. We were able to complete a lot of the necessary business and have the mayor of the city of Bahir Dar sign the designation of our property in the village of Tis Abay for the building of our Children's Home. We have finally opened our office in a decent facility in Bahir Dar and are anxiously waiting to go to work on our building site. Currently we are waiting for the last leg of our NGO operation and we can finally begin to build.

While Pastor John was here we were able to visit and preach in several churches but the highlight of his visit was when we all attended the Baptismal service for seven of our children already in our rented Children's home. The Pastor of the Full Gospel Church in Bahir Dar presided over the service and then one by one each child gave their testimony of confessing their sin and receiving Christ as their Lord and Savior and were Baptized. What great joy it brought to all of us as several other Pastor's in the community joined in the celebration. We had a special party for the girls with cake and coffee following the service.

There is so much we want and are ready to do for the fatherless children in our area. We are ready to drill a well on our new property and ready to build a nice building that will house 100 to 150 helpless, hopeless children but we wait for the government to release the land to us before we can begin. Please be in prayer with us that this will be accomplished quickly.

As we listened to the testimonies of the girls that were Baptized we were so moved by each one of them as to their boldness in their faith. One of the girls shared with us how she watched her mother and father die of AIDS and no one was there to help them except her. She tended to them until they died. She shared that she was so alone until she came to NHOM Children's Village where she was just loved. She shared that she wanted to help the helpless in her nation by becoming a nurse and possibly a doctor in the future. She is ranked number 1 in her class and will take entry level exams in the near future to further her education.

Had no one given her the opportunity she would be just another statistic of a wandering street kid begging or prostituting herself on the streets. We have the opportunity to impact the lives of many children both now and in the future.

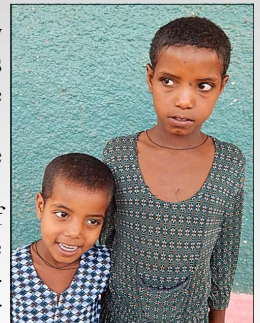

Getting acquainted closer with children, we learn about their difficult fate in life. Though they have lived only a short time they have experienced so much adversity. In spite of all the difficulties and troubles most children are very kind and open. We talked with a boy named Dima he is at the shelter with his sister and a younger brother. Each time when their mother breaks down and starts to drink, they are taken to a shelter. We told Dima that God can change this situation through his prayer. The main thing is not to give up and to believe in God.

We noticed that when we give time to the individual child, they open up to us and start to tell about themselves, many times children ask questions. We can advise them and point them to the Lord. After the program the caregivers told us thank you for the fact that we, to some extent, help them in their work. Bring up children in an acceptable and simple way and presenting important truths to them by our visits and presentations.

There were 35 children and 7 adults at this orphanage. This was our second time at this orphanage, and traveling with us was a group of hairdressers. Children came and got their hair cut, while others watched the photos, cartoons and a film called «Godman». We had more time for individual communication with the children, and in the end gave them balloons and special treats.

The City of Kalinovo

All the kids from the orphanage came to the program and all the staff came as well. We pray that God has touched and changed not only the children, but also teachers and staff so they might have wisdom in the approach to each child.

The City of Klenovskoe

Children always carefully watch with great interest and participate in our programs we present. In addition, we talked with the children about how they can turn to God and fellowship with Him at any time and in any place. And God hears them because he loves them.
