### Look At The Fields They Are Ripe For Harvest

Everywhere we look in Ethiopia there are such great needs. From the cities, villages and farmland there are people desperate for someone to help. Sickness and disease run rampant in every community. There are 91 million people in Ethiopia and very few doctors or nurses who will care for the poor, sick or dying. We at NHOM International are trying to do what we can for

orphans. We have been attacked from every angle. Politicians say they are for us yet are unwilling to make decisions that will expedite the process of helping.

Many of you know we have started our building project in Ethiopia to help house and care for orphans. So far in the process we have had our water well destroyed by a local religious group and this same group has effectively temporarily shut down our building project. Ambele Nagash, (pictured above center picture with the group is on the right hand side) myself, Gizie and our team visited city officials including the Vice-Mayor, Mayor, Vice-President and President of the Amharic Region trying to get answers as to why they did not intervene in such a blatant display of lawlessness. All of them told me the same thing, they would have matters taken care of before I left back to America. I have been back for more than two months and we are still waiting on decisions that will get our contractor back to work building and completing our project.

In the meantime we wonder how many children we could be helping and are not because of such delays.

Please pray for this matter with us. Pray for the leaders to make right and just decisions that will benefit the fatherless children in this area of the world. Pray the same prayer for the leaders of America.

### Bethlehem

*We at NHOM International are so proud of being a part of the lives of the children God has granted us the care of. Bethlehem is just one example of the exemplary and blessed children we care for. She and her sister were one of the first to come to our New Hope Children's village in 2008. She was 8 years old. Both parents had died and no one cared for her. She entered our program with no education and now at the age of 16 goes into the 12th grade level ranking 2nd in her nation academically. She plans to enter the university to study to become a doctor so she can help those on the streets who are so sick and who are so needful. Thanks to Blessed Hope Assembly in Lewiston, ID we were able to give her a laptop computer to help her along the way.*



### Who Is My Neighbor?

I am asked this question quite frequently and the answer is simple, everyone is your neighbor. Jesus met people for the first time and immediately they were loved by Him even before He met them. I'll give you a modern day example.

Ambele Nagash and myself were sitting at a outdoor coffee shop in Bahir Dar, Ethiopia. We were people watching and discussing some important matters in regards to our orphanage. Hundreds of people were walking by us including many beggars when all of a sudden a woman came and sat on the ground at the feet of Ambele.

She was ill and all of her fingers were missing. She had leprosy. Ambele asked her to sit on a chair and she told him she could not because she was not worthy to sit with us. She began to talk and almost immediately she began to cry. She shared that she had leprosy and that in the progress of her disease that her husband, family and children had deserted her and will have nothing to do with her. The community in general avoids her as well.

Through her story telling Ambele managed to talk her into sitting in a chair. All those around us were appalled and even the waitress avoided her and people walking by just glared at us and walked out of their way to avoid us. He spent some time just loving her and then bought her something to eat.

The widow was amazed that someone would care enough to spend time and care for her in such a manner. Before she left Ambele gave her a hug and she just didn't know how to respond and she wept and thanked him profusely.

In the fall of 2013, Haset started attending Biola University in La Mirada, CA having received a prestigious academic award for her excellence in her studies and a leadership award for her community involvement and ministry engagements. During her time at Biola University, Haset served as a Student Orientation Services leader, as well as a Biola Ambassador. In the fall of 2014, Haset joined the Student Missionary Union to be a part of the student group that would go to India to help the needy and share the good news of salvation by grace. She traveled to India with seven other students and she cared for children, played with them, carried them on her

back, and more than anything, she shared with them her testimony. Unfortunately, while on this mission trip, she suffered an extreme asthma attack and left this side of the world and entered eternal glory.

Haset was a young woman who was dedicated to serving others and making sure that their needs were met before her own. She was outspoken, talented, willing to help, and a teacher to children of all ages whether at her home church in Seattle, or in a small village in India. She made family functions fun and enjoyable. Even the games that she created taught others God's Words and Biblical principles.

She was a gem and a true joy of her family. A devoted Christian, an excellent student, a wonderful relative, a fun roommate, a considerate neighbor, a beautiful soul and much more. Not only did she speak of God's Words, but she also lived them.

Haset wrote a note and left these words in her bedroom, "I know where I am going, I trust you God."

Pastor Ambele Nagash and his wife Fasika and all those who had a part in Haset's life are grieving but not with a grief that is eternal but only temporary. For they know that their daughter, sister and friend is with Jesus. They also have the assurance that one day they will see her alive in Heaven in the presence of Almighty God.

You too can have that great assurance by taking a few steps on your own. Salvation is a personal matter no one can receive salvation for you. You aren't saved by your church or your Pastor or Priest, not by your parents or grandparents. You weren't born with salvation. Salvation comes through Jesus Christ and none other. Simply confess to God that you are a sinner. Ask God to forgive you. Ask the Lord Jesus Christ to wipe away your sins and ask Him to come into your life. Ask Him to help you lead a life that is pleasing to Him. If you truly mean what you say in asking Him to forgive you, He will do just that. If you truly invite Him into your life, He will come in. He actually adopts you into His Kingdom as His own special child. Just like any good father He will guide you into the things that please Him. He will lead you into His righteous world with love, mercy and grace.

At NHOM International our teams lead 200 to 400 souls a week in the prayer of Salvation. We are seeing so many people set free from the bondage of sin.

Pastor Ambele is on the Board of Directors at NHOM International as an advisor. We have a total of 10 men and 1 woman on the Board of Directors and we hurt with the family for the loss of their daughter. But, we, like them, have the assurance of knowing that one day we will see our loved ones who have gone on before us. We will see them in the Throne Room of God, we will sing with them, fellowship with them, hold them and never have to say our goodbyes again.

We at NHOM International hope that you have that same kind of assurance in your life as Haset had in her life. We love you and believe the best for you and your family.
