Evelyn' Ongoing Testimony

Yes, this is a song, but also my strength since September 8, 2015. This is when I could hardly walk because I could hardly breathe. My daughter in law, Dori and son, John Jr. were here and John was in Ethiopia. Dori insisted I go to the hospital. I was in critical condition, but they did not know what was wrong other than I needed oxygen. After many many tests, they determined I had pulmonary fibrosis. Caused by a drug, Methotrexate. I was on heavy oxygen 24/7. Because John was in Ethiopia, he could not get home for several days. Our kids were here and had to make decisions. I was too weak to be home alone. They all had to work. So I went to Life Care for rehabilitation. John got home as fast as possible a week later. Because of weakness I stayed at Life Care. I had therapy every day. Then three weeks later I went home.

I also had a choice to make at that time, I could have the poor me's or hang on to Jesus, the sweetest name I know. God tells us in His word to take every opportunity to share the love of Jesus. I could not share if I was in the dumps all the time. Little did I know this was just the beginning.

I was in the hospital for 7 days then rehab for 3 weeks. Sent home and two days later while visiting the doctor in Spokane he told me that I had two choices, 1) He would let me go back to Clarkston and that I would probably be dead before I got there or 2) he would put me back in another hospital in Spokane. I was still on oxygen, 5 liters was not enough. A few times it was 13 liters. I was put on a strong dose of prednisone. I could not even go to rehabilitation unless my oxygen was 5 liters. 8 days later I was transferred back to Life Care Rehab. I praise God, He was my strength. I don't know what I would have done without Him. Family and friends all over the world were, and still are, praying for me. I had many opportunities to share the love of Jesus with Doctors and nurses (they were my angels) and hospital staff.

Jesus is the sweetest name I know and His presence is always with me.

I was blessed to be home for Thanksgiving and Christmas. Then Jan 3, 2016 I woke up so weak, I called for my friend, Brenda, who was staying with me to help me. John was gone to preach in Acme, WA some 400 miles from home and Brenda had come to stay with me until he returned. Then I fell and fractured my leg and my blood pressure went dangerously low, yet my oxygen level was great. She called 911 and John. Only 2 liters. At the hospital they shocked my heart. And once again I was there for 5 days, then to Life Care again. On February 8, I was back in the hospital with a GI bleed. More x-rays more tests. My blood count was 8. They were going to give me a blood transfusion, but God intervened. More tests! Determined I have SVT and Colitis added to the pulmonary fibrosis. This gave me more opportunities to Praise God and share the love of Jesus! By this time I knew most of the staff at Life Care by name. They liked coming into my room. Said it was peaceful. I know it was Jesus.

I know Jesus is the sweetest name I know. He is the healer. I am home now and only on oxygen when doing a lot of walking.

He is not finished with me yet. I am on new medications. Feeling better. Still

weak but each day a little stronger.

I thank God for all the prayers. God is my source and my strength. Don't stop praying. John will be going to Ethiopia in September. Pray, pray, pray! Remember the enemy is out to steal kill and destroy. Jesus comes to give life. We have a lot of widows and orphans to show the love of Jesus to so they can have life.
